Considering becoming a home inspector?

It takes courage to begin thinking about a new career.

If you're reading this, there's a good chance you're looking to make a change. Maybe you're ready to move on from an unsatisfying job, earn extra income with part-time work, have more flexibility in your schedule, or transition into a career that's less physically demanding. At ICA, we're here to help you take that next step.

But you probably also have lots of questions, like: Do I need to have prior knowledge or training for this career? What do I need to do in order to become licensed? Will it take a long time to train? Is the training expensive? Will I be able to get a job?

Let us put your mind at ease, because home inspection is one of the simplest careers to get into. You do not need to have prior knowledge of real estate or construction before you begin training. You also do not need a college degree. Most states only require a high school diploma or GED. Training can be very affordable, and in most cases, you can begin working in a matter of months, not years.

Once you are certified, your job prospects are very bright. Home inspectors are in demand in virtually every city in the US. Most of our graduates pass their board exam the first time (if required), and many go on to start successful businesses.

Is home inspection right for me?

See below for answers to some of the most commonly asked questions regarding home inspection careers, training, and certification from the experts at ICA.

Q: Is there currently demand for home inspectors?

A: Absolutely. Right now there is a shortage of certified home inspectors in almost every market in the United States and Canada. Real estate is in high demand, which makes it very likely you will be able to find a job after you become certified.

Q: How much would I make in a year as a home inspector?

A: It depends. In order to figure out how much you might earn, you'll need to ballpark how many inspections you will do. If you're planning on working part-time, you may only do 1-3 inspections per week. Full time inspectors can plan for around two per day with time for administrative tasks, for an average of 8-12 inspections per week.

With this information, you can calculate your potential earnings. Each area is different, but the national average cost is \$475 per home inspection. Doing the simple math, if you do 5 inspections per week, that will net you around \$123,500 a year. You could also increase your income by adding ancillary services to your business like radon testing, mold testing, and other services.

Q: What career choices would I have as a home inspector?

A: There are many! Here are some options to consider:

- Most commonly, you can work part-time or full-time inspecting residential homes and/or commercial businesses
- You can offer secondary services like mold inspections, radon testing, and HUD (Housing and Urban Development) inspections
- You can work for a municipality as a construction or building code inspector
- You can become a FEMA inspector
- You can start your own multi-inspector business

Considering becoming a home inspector?

Q: Do I need to have certain skills or a background to become a home inspector?

A: No. A high school diploma or GED is required in many US states, but other than this you do not need to come into home inspector training with any specific knowledge or background. You will simply need a strong desire to learn, an interest in homes and real estate, and an ability to work with people to get started.

Q: How long does it take to become certified?

A: It depends. There are several factors involved, including what is required for certifying in the state you will practice in, how much time you have to dedicate to training, and how long it takes you to pass your board exam (if applicable). See our home inspection state licensing page to find out specific info for your area.

Note: The good news is that ICA can help guide you through the process of learning the home inspection business, preparing for the exam (if applicable), and providing the resources you need, so you can get your career started with confidence. Most students that train with us can begin their new career within a few months.

Q: How expensive is home inspection training?

A: It depends. A fully online home inspector course can cost somewhere between \$700 - \$1,500. Costs for in-person classes and/or field training with a licensed inspector can vary widely and are anywhere from \$1,300 - \$4,000.

It's important to do your research on the total costs involved, as some training providers charge extra for certain items, such as:

Preparing you for the state or national home inspector exam • Training on topics like commercial inspection • Mold and radon inspection • Business development skills like how to start and market your business • They also may charge as much as \$1,000 per year for inspection reporting software.

Did you know? ICA includes software with all training packages—free for you to use for life as a student.

Steps to become a licensed home inspector

Serious about making a career change? The steps below will help you think through your process to becoming a licensed home inspector in your state.

1. Check the home inspection requirements for your state

The guidelines for becoming a home inspector can vary depending on where you plan to start your career. Some states require a certain number of hours for training, attending a number of hands-on field training inspections with a certified home inspector, and/or taking a state licensing exam before you can begin.

In other cases there may be no state requirements at all, in which case you can get a leg up on other inspectors by taking an online training course so you can learn the ins and outs of inspecting before you get started.

To find out the process for getting licensed in your state, visit the State Licensing page on the ICA website, which has all of the details you need.

2. Take a home inspection training course

In most states you can start with an online course to learn the nuts and bolts of home inspection, and then transition to a live course and finally a series of "field training" sessions where you work with a licensed inspector to practice in actual homes.

In some states, there are no specific requirements to inspect homes, so all you will need to do is take the online course and then begin inspecting when you feel ready!

3. Take a state or national licensing exam (where required)

The final step of becoming licensed in most areas is to take a state board licensing exam, which most quality training programs will prepare you for. If your state does not have a specific exam, you may need to take the national exam (NHIE).

If you reside in a state that does not require any exam, you can still take the NHIE in order to have that credential on your resume, to give you a leg up on other inspectors!
